
Dear Parents & Carers,

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	<p>To introduce phonic skills through the 'Letters and Sounds' programme and 'Jolly Phonics'.</p> <p>To introduce independent writing focussing on the teaching of the correct letter formation and writing words and phrases that match their taught grapheme-phoneme correspondences.</p> <p>To introduce reading books, encouraging them to sound out and blend words that match their grapheme-phoneme correspondences as well as read some sight words.</p> <p>To encourage children to speak and listen confidently.</p>
Mathematics	<p>To introduce the numbers 0-10 and to develop confidence in practical activities e.g. sorting, matching, number games and counting.</p> <p>To recognise and order numerals to 10.</p> <p>To introduce simple adding and taking away in the form of one more and one less.</p>
Understanding of the World	<p>The subject areas covered are Science, History, Geography, RE and ICT. The curriculum areas will be delivered through the following topics: Amazing Me and Relationships and Christmas.</p> <p>To explore the local environment through 'Welly Walks' and outdoor learning.</p> <p>To develop computing skills using the code-a-pillars, beebots and games on the interactive whiteboard.</p> <p>To develop a good sense of self through all about me activities, sharing stories with others and to develop an understanding of similarities and differences amongst cultures and communities.</p>
Expressive Arts and Design (Art and DT)	<p>To develop drawing skills through observational drawing.</p> <p>To develop a range of painting skills e.g. printing.</p> <p>To explore colour and colour mixing.</p> <p>To develop the children's enjoyment of music through singing and listening to different kinds of music and rhymes.</p>
Physical Development	<p>To introduce team games, incorporating ball skills and the use of small apparatus.</p> <p>To improve co-ordination through dance and movement.</p> <p>To develop fine motor skills through a range of activities such as threading, cutting and playdough.</p> <p>To become increasingly independent when dressing and with their personal care needs.</p>


Assemblies take place daily. We have a whole school assembly on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday and on Wednesday and Friday we will have our own class assemblies.


## MATHS

To carry out practical maths activities at home e.g. counting objects and spotting shapes.




## ENGLISH
