Dear Parents and Carers,

May / June half-term arrangements:

As over previous holiday periods, schools need to continue track and trace procedures for any positive COVID-19 cases over half-term.

Positive COVID-19 cases during half-term:

During the four-day window which follows the last day of term (up to and including 3pm on Tuesday 1st June), if your child tests positive for COVID-19, please email the school office at: office@kingfisher.ppat365.org – this email address will be checked at 3pm each day for any new positive cases. After receiving an email informing us of a positive case, you will then be called by myself to obtain further details.

If a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms **within 48 hours of being in school**, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and will provide guidance from Public Health England, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school.

If your child is in the affected 'bubble', you will receive notification via email and also a text message prompting you to check your emails.

Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms **more than 48 hours** since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

After Tuesday 1st June, if your child returns a positive test, there is no need to email the school to inform us, unless they are not going to be able to return on Tuesday 8th June 2021.

Please remember that if you are travelling outside of the UK at half-term, certain countries do have quarantine periods on your return to England. For further information, please visit: <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/red-amber-and-green-list-rules-for-entering-england#stay-up-to-date>
