Year 6 swimming assessment

- All our children are taught a range of swim strokes such as front crawl, backstroke, and breaststroke as well as a self-rescue technique.
- Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 have a weekly swimming lesson for half a term each year.
- Catch up lessons are completed in the summer term.
- We strongly encourage parents to support our efforts by taking their children swimming in addition to school lessons to ensure all children swim competently.
