


# Kingfisher Primary School Curriculum Information

Year	Y6
Term	Spring 2025

Dear Parents & Carers, This letter is designed to provide key information about your child's learning this term. If you have any questions. Please speak to your child's class teacher.

SUBJECT	CONTENT
English	Through studying the English National Curriculum, we will be reading a variety of fiction and non-fictional texts. In writing, children will be able to story write, produce character descriptions, construct letters for a range of purposes, take notes and create poems. Spelling, punctuation, grammar and handwriting will be taught throughout these lessons. We will also develop our speaking and listening skills.
Mathematics	In the Mathematics National Curriculum, we will be studying geometry, looking at the angles of shapes and how to accurately construct shapes. Then, we will move onto algebra and look at how to use and solve equations. As well as that, we will be studying ratio and proportion before revisiting and revising previous topics.
Science	Children will study animals including humans. This will involve exploring the vital organs of the body and looking at their functions. Also, the children will be exploring evolution and the scientific discoveries made from this theory.
Computing	Children will learn to use Microsoft Excel to handle and explore data. As well as this, children will learn to create formulae and tables from their data. They will use a range of sources to research different topics that link to separate areas of the curriculum. Children will learn about Online Safety and responsible internet usage.
Geography	Children will study land use and the settlements in Europe and England. Looking at a variety of locations the children will explore how the land has been used and why it is used that way. Additionally, the children will explore natural resources of Europe.
History	We will be studying the Ancient Mayan people. This topic will cover the key elements of Mayan life and culture. The children will make comparisons within and across this era of history. Using a range of sources, children will draw conclusions based on their findings.
RE	The children will look closely at a range of religions and beliefs. They will learn about Christianity and more specifically the idea of salvation. This topic will link to the Christian festival of Easter and will allow children to understand why the event is so important.
Music	The children will continue to develop skills and techniques in music. They will learn a range of different songs in a variety of different styles and genres. The children will also learn to project voices and how to perform as a group.
D & T + Art	Our Art will focus on Spinski and his work on sculpture. The children will look to explore and expand their skill with clay. As well as this, the children are learning to crochet as part of our Textiles project. The children will develop their own crochet design.
PE	The children will learn a range of invasion and striking games. They will learn awareness of space, balance and co-ordination. In gymnastics, the children will study balance and control of body movement.
French	The children will continue to develop their vocabulary in French exploring new words in the topics they cover. As well as this, the children will learn to build sentences and begin to say these in French.


## Homework



#### **MATHS**

Consolidation of work carried out that week. Pages from the CPG book

#### **ENGLISH**

Grammar and sentence work. Homework tasks should be completed in the CPG book unless stated otherwise.

Children should also use this as an opportunity to practise their handwriting.



#### **SPELLING**

Variety of spellings including prefixes, suffixes and common exception words.

Children are encouraged to look at and practise their spellings over the course of the week, ready for the test on Friday.



#### READING

Regular reading at home is encouraged; we expect our pupils to read every day at home and at least 3 times a week for 10 minutes to an adult.

Reading record books should be signed by an adult when your child has read to you and returned every day with your child's reading book. These will be checked weekly.
