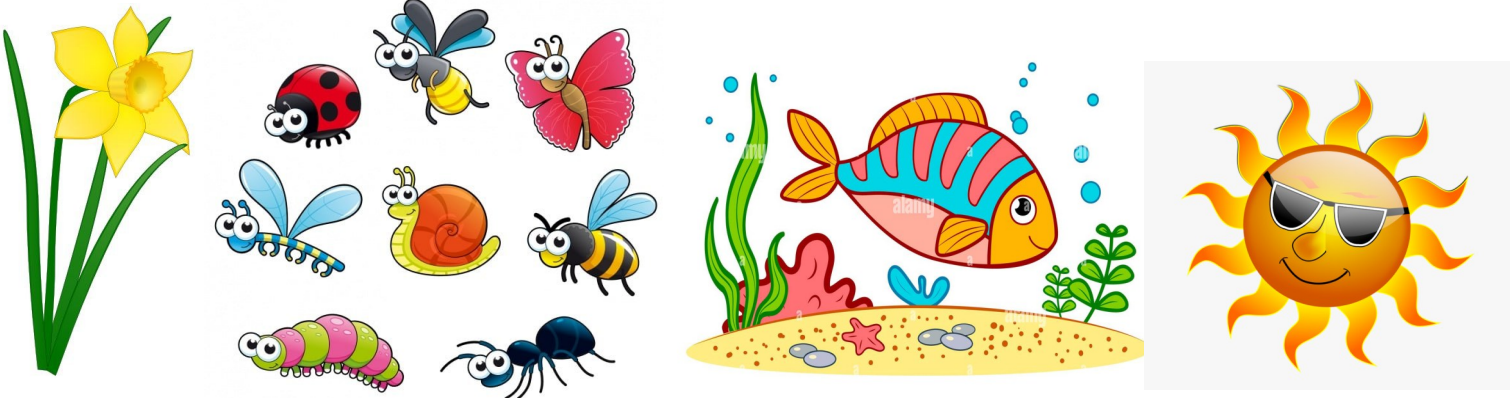
I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a lovely Easter break, and we look forward to welcoming everyone back for another fun-filled term after the Easter holidays.

Next term we will be exploring the topics: Spring, Animals & Minibeasts, Under the Sea and Summer.

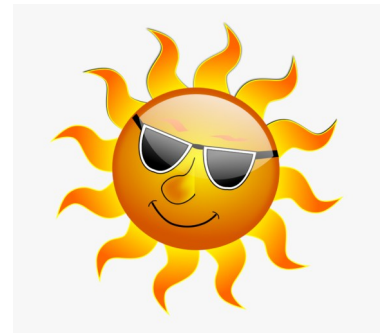


## Sun Safety Reminder

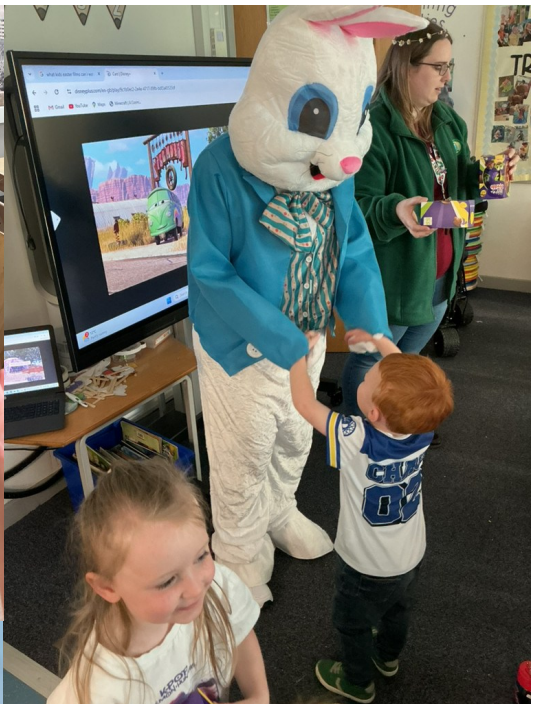
## Visit from Pete the Poet
